

We wish you a pleasant stay in Ljubljana.



About our academy

ALUO operates within the University of Ljubljana (UL). It is proud of its tradition. It was established on 27 October 1945 as the Academy of Fine Arts, providing courses in painting and sculpture. Throughout the years the Academy changed its name a few times, and expanded its activities in line with its development. In 1984 the studies expanded by incorporating industrial design and visual communications design, and a good ten years later it also introduced conservation/restoration.

Now the courses are organised within five ALUO departments covering the areas of visual arts, conservation/restoration and design. The studies are carried out in small groups, where we develop student creativity and innovation through an individual approach involving consultations, corrections, discussions and seminars, emphasising the importance and the role of our disciplines in the broader social context in order to build individual responsibility. The courses also include theoretical topics and the acquisition of technical and technological skills.

As the extent of our international student exchange is among the largest in comparison with the other institutions within our university, it needs to be emphasised that we cooperate with foreign partners through student exchanges and the inclusion of foreign students in the projects, exhibitions, competitions, conferences, etc.

Why study at our academy?

You will study in a dynamic environment, surrounded by galleries, museums and other cultural institutions;

You will acquire state-of-the-art knowledge about visual arts, conservation/restoration and design taught in an interdisciplinary way, also taking into account other disciplines;

The studies are organised in small groups, emphasising an individual approach and also involving international experts and lecturers;


We provide the training and practical experiences needed for the development of an independent and innovative artist;


As a student you will have the opportunity to participate in several national and international projects, exhibitions, competitions, etc.;

We cooperate with national museums and galleries, private galleries, design bureaus and industry;

We encourage student mobility.





Exchange programmes at our academy

The growth of the quality of our study programmes, the possibility of comparing our achievements with those attained by foreign establishments, informing our students and teachers on the study systems abroad, and increasing public awareness about ourselves - all this urges us to continue and even deepen all possible ways of cooperation with foreign higher education institutions similar to ours. Our international activity is being enriched by permanent cooperation with numerous academies and faculties within the exchange programmes, in particular the Erasmus+ programme. Foreign experts also lecture regularly in various programmes as a result of individual initiatives and informal arrangements.

ERASMUS+

Erasmus+ brings together seven existing EU programmes in the fields of Education, Training, and Youth; it will for the first time provide support for Sport. As an integrated programme, Erasmus+ offers more opportunities for cooperation across the Education, Training, Youth, and Sport sectors and is easier to access than its predecessors, with simplified funding rules.

CEEPUS

CEEPUS is an acronym for "Central European Exchange Programme for University Studies". Current member countries are: Albania, Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Poland, Romania, Serbia, the Slovak Republic and Slovenia. Pristina/Kosovo is also participating.

CEEPUS programme supports scholarships to individuals within an approved network of major higher education institutions from different participating countries which then exchange students and professors.

How to apply for an exchange programme

DEADLINES FOR ERASMUS EXCHANGE

Exchange students apply twice a year: <u>15 May – winter semester and full year</u> 15 November – summer semester

In addition to the on-line application, it is obligatory to submit a porfolio to the following e-mail address: *jasmina.zajc@aluo.uni-lj.si*

You will be informed about our decision within 8 weeks.

RECOMMENDED LANGUAGE SKILLS

The minimum required level of English for studying at the Academy of Fine Arts and Design is B2.

Academic Calendar

SEMESTER1 (WINTER SEMESTER):

Duration: beginning of October to mid January

Final examinations: mid January to mid February

SEMESTER 2 (SUMMER SEMESTER):

Duration: mid February to beginning of June

Final examinations: beginning of June to beginning of July

SELECTION OF COURSES

Courses can be selected only from the list of courses of all departments. At the end of the semester students obtain grades and credit points for each selected course.

The Academy of Fine Arts and Design doesn't offer courses in English. We suggest that incoming students choose practical courses, where individual consultations in English with professors are possible. Please note that your level of English knowledge should be at least intermediate!

MEDICAL INSURANCE

Foreign students coming from the EU member countries and the countries of the European economic region should have the E 128 form, E 111 form or E-card. The document type depends on the authorized insurance agency of the country of their origin. Namely, the students should contact the authorized insurance agency, where they have been insured, and ask for one of the above-mentioned forms. If you have no health insurance in your home country, you can contact the insurance company that will cover your insurance in the Republic of Slovenia (ASSISTANCE CORIS, UI. Accommodation

STUDENT DORMITORIES

Erasmus students can apply for a bed in student dormitories. They are given to students on "first come first serve" basis. The rooms in the dormitories are double, with bathroom and shared kitchen. The access to internet is available in almost all the dormitories.

The Housing Form students will be able to send upon filling out online application by by 15 May (first semester) or 15 November (second semester).
