


Compared to many other institutions in the area of art and design education, we are small and quite specific due to the historical, cultural and social influences that have shaped our coexistence in this cultural space.








UL ALUO is ideally located in Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia, a country of two million people. Despite its small size, the country is diverse and geographically interesting, encompassing the Alpine, Karst, Littoral and Pannonian regions, which gives it a distinctive character. In everyday life, this provides endless opportunities for excursions and exploring natural, cultural and culinary phenomena.

On the other hand, Ljubljana's position allows connections with interesting centres of artistic production such as Zagreb (140km), Venice (240km), Vienna (385km), Munich (406km), Milan (497km) and Belgrade (531km). These are also centres that influenced Slovenian culture in th past.

Ljubljana is a very safe city. The majority of people in Slovenia speak at least one foreign language, and most are fluent in English. So, even if you don't want to deal with Slovene, which is a grammatically highly complex Slavic language, communication is not a problem.


In Slovenia alone, UL ALUO regularly cooperates with more than 100 institutions, which allows for the constant testing of ideas on the market and in society, and offers students real-world networking opportunities with future clients, collaborators and projects.



Resolution on Declaring a Climate and Environmental Emergency

The Higher Education Sustainability Initiative – HESI was established in 2012 with the mission to work together with the United Nations in order to permanently link higher education institutions to science and green policy-making. By adopting the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) in 2019, the initiative developed into a resolution.


More than 300 institutions have so far adopted the proposed resolution and declared a climate and environmental emergency. We are committing to a joint long-term sustainability plan with the following objectives:

- Achieving carbon-neutrality at the institution level by 2030 (or by 2050 at the latest);
- Redirecting and obtaining funding for action-oriented research in the fields relevant to climate change and building skills and competencies in these fields;
- Increasing the scope of sustainability-related material in the curricula and other study programmes with the aim of raising public awareness.

The climate crisis is one of the greatest threats facing our society. UL ALUO is responsible for reducing its own environmental impact and plays an especially important role in education about environmental and social issues, as well as in supporting climate action through its research.





We recruit individuals from a wide range of disciplines with exceptional potential. Many of our members of staff are actively involved in














UL ALUO is the oldest Slovenian tertiary institution for painting, sculpture, restoration, design, video, photography, graphic arts and illustration. It was established in 1945 and is now part of the University of Ljubljana.

It has been actively involved in all the crucial events in the history of the Slovenian art, design and restoration professions, as a large majority

of the painters, sculptors, designers and restorers working in Slovenia, as well as the lecturers teaching today at the Academy, were educated here.

Various departments have been established (notably the Department of Design in 1984 and the Department of Restoration in 1996) over time and the numbers of students have increased. We are still persisting in our search for a better solution for our working environment that will combine all the departments in one location to improve artistic and research practices.




The Research Institute



Department of Painting

Painting BA Mentor:

Painting BA

Nowadays, painting is an organic and dynamic part of the contemporary art system and, at the same time, an art field with an extremely diverse



and development-based history and many modes of expression. The first-cycle study programme in painting is organised as a combination of studio, theoretical and technical courses with the aim of helping the students develop their basic artistic orientations. The programme enables students to acquire the general and specific knowledge and skills necessary for their development towards professional careers and artistic practices that require aesthetic skills and innovative approaches.

Painting MA

The second-cycle painting programme is designed with the aim of facilitating the personal development of students towards independent and critical artistic creation, professional artistic activity, and enabling them to work in the related areas of cultural activities.

The programme covers only the necessary mandatory topics, as it is appropriate for this level of study that the students create their own curricula. The core of the programme is the student's own artistic output and the related Master's project consisting of a work of art and its theoretical justification.


Video, Animation and New Media BA

The study of video, animation and new media covers a wide range of creative possibilities offered by modern technologies. The programme's main objective is to provide the students with basic knowledge of video production, film, 3D modelling, animation and interactive projects. The course is based on digital tools and includes the use of both licensed and open-source software in combination with analogue techniques. The first-level students are taught how to use the tools, which gives them the opportunity to develop their own authorial approach and to place their work in an appropriate artistic, historical, theoretical and social context.

Video, Animation and New Media MA

The aim of the master's level study programme in video, animation and new media is to prepare students for more complex multimedia projects involving film, 3D modelling, animation and interactive projects. The approach is individual and aims to complement and build

on the student's initial idea in both theoretical and practical work. We encourage interdisciplinary collaboration, with ongoing collaborations with the Faculty of Computer and Information Science, the Academy of Theatre, Radio, Film and Television and the Academy of Music. The students participate in various projects involving other members of the University of Ljubljana. They also collaborate with professionals on a project basis. The acquired skills enable students to work independently and apply for national and international public tenders and work in the creative industry.



Printmaking MA

The fundamental goal of the master's degree in printmaking is to train students for independent work in the field of graphic art, which means

recognising the specific possibilities of printmaking techniques and practices in individual expression and articulation. Their work in the printmaking studio is designed as a project, enabling a complex approach to studies and selected issues within the expanded field of graphic art. Students are able to connect visual and substantive ideas and understand the impact of new technologies in the context of graphic arts and visual arts in general. They are also trained to carry out demanding graphic work in combination with other media and are able to present them appropriately.

Department of Sculpture

Sculpture BA

The first-cycle study programme in sculpture gives students the opportunity to develop broad and knowledgeable personalities through a combination of theoretical/conceptual and practical/technical procedures. While learning about the past and modern sculptural languages and developing one's own expressions, the course encourages students to be curious and analytical, carrying out contextual research and identifying various themes, forms and procedures in an interdisciplinary way.


Students learn about the complex relationships between the material, content-related, formal, ontological and imaginary layers, as well as about the social conditions for sculptural forms and their perception.

Sculpture MA

The second-cycle study programme directs the student to become an independent creator who masters not only the basic knowledge and practices to create independent works of art, but

also new knowledge and experience in the areas their abilities can relate to: e.g. the gallery system, systems of presentation and exhibition, the social functions of art and its significance in integration processes in society.


The programme leads to in-depth knowledge and practices, encouraging creativity and artistic research that, under the conditions of the continual development of art, an expansion of styles, tools, media and different approaches, is an element of artistic activity that allows creative complexity, vision and an open attitude towards art today.



Department of the Conservation and Restoration of Works of Art

Conservation and Restoration of Works of Art BA

In the first-cycle study programme, students learn the methods of research work and preventive conservation, as well as active, modern conservation/restoration in a wider sense: easel paintings, polychrome wooden sculptures, wall paintings and stone. In the final study year, students develop their skills during mandatory practical work in the studios, museums, galleries



and the Restoration Centre of the Institute for the Protection of the Cultural Heritage of Slovenia, where they acquire an in-depth knowledge of the technical, scientific, artistic and organisational aspects of conservation/restoration.

(A) Conservation and Restoration of Paintings and Polychrome Wooden Sculptures MA

(B) Conservation and Restoration of Wall Paintings and Stone MA

In the second-cycle study programme, students can choose between two courses, (A) and (B). These allow students to deepen their skills and knowledge necessary for research and development tasks related to restoring art materials, where each area requires specific solutions. The goal of the programme is to produce professionals who are capable of independent handling and managing demanding conservation/restoration tasks in various materials.

Department of Industrial Design and Applied Arts

Industrial Design BA

Our mission is to facilitate the development of talented individuals qualified for design research, while focusing on creating innovative and sustainable products and services. For six consecutive years, the Department of Industrial Design has been ranked among the top 50 design schools in Europe.

The aim of the programme is the acquisition of the basic knowledge necessary for understanding the profession of industrial design and its impact on society, the environment and culture. Through theory courses, design methodologies, practical and multidisciplinary studies based partly on one-on-one teaching, we enable students to think imaginatively about the possibilities of design.

Industrial Design MA

This course is organised as a highly multi- and trans-disciplinary study aiming at in-depth project work addressing pressing social, user and

planet-related problems. It is based on both real and speculative projects and carried out in association with numerous partners from the private, public and nongovernmental sectors. Students acquire the capacities to critically undertake and practically deal with issues of product, service, system and regenerative design, while pushing the boundaries of what design can be and do. We encourage students to understand how design is set to address and affect change within contemporary society and guide them in the search for insightful design solutions.



Applied Arts BA

The Bachelor's programme of applied arts researches the potential of and approaches to working with glass and ceramics materials as its main focus. The study program also provides a creative starting point for exploring other areas and concepts in different materials and media. The programme is, to a large extent, organised as individual studio work, encouraging interdisciplinarity and experimentation. We encourage students to approach creative work with curiosity, independency and critical thought. Through individual consultations and tutoring, we help students develop their personal poetics, guiding them towards responding subtly to the needs and wishes of the individual and societal changes through personal poetics within art and design.

Applied Arts MA

The Master's program enables a deeper understanding of different materials as mediums in art and design. Applied arts designers are distinguished by their deeper understanding of materials and the procedures involved in their forming, especially those for glass and ceramics. With their comprehensive theoretical and

practical knowledge, they can continually discover possibilities for new expressions and new ways of using, exploring and combining different media. We deeply encourage interdisciplinary, research, experimentation and search into the unknown. We strive to enable students to work independently in art or design, in either small studios or large production facilities, and to open their minds to be critical, skilful, thoughtful, cooperative and responsive actors of tomorrow's world.



Department of Visual Communication Design

Photography BA

Despite the abundance of images that surround us, giving the impression that we can all be photographers, a knowledge of light is the key to understanding our environment in its broadest possible sense. The first-cycle study programme in photography thus starts with understanding light as a physical phenomenon and finishes with light as a concept.

Through individual work, we combine the knowledge of technical procedures, history and theory, providing a wide range of skills necessary for a photographer's integration into contemporary society. If the power of presentation is the merit of an artist, the power of foresight is the key feature of a photographer.

Photography MA

The indivisibility of light, time and space teaches us that it is easy to follow the trends but much more difficult to predict or even dictate them. The study of photography at the second-cycle level is distinctly associated with theory, primarily focused

on an understanding of images, while accuracy and precision represent the tools serving the messages conveyed.

The course questions the established practices of the photographic language and lays new foundations by allowing the students to choose their own expressions adapted for use in various individual or group projects.



Graphic Design BA

The first-level study programme of graphic design provides a theoretical basis, as well as technological knowledge in combination with design communication skills related to the fields of typography, illustration and photography. The students learn how to plan their assignments—either individually or in a team—while also learning the design process from the initial conception to the realisation through a variety of projects. The knowledge acquired in the process enables them to work independently on medium-difficulty visual-communication tasks.

Graphic Design MA

The master's level study programme of graphic design focuses on the development of the students' personal authorial approach. The focus is on theoretically sound and communication-supported systems that go beyond routine practices. Through research and experimentation, the study programme encourages innovation and the search for new approaches in visual and conceptual solutions. The aim is to prepare the students to be able to take on systemic visual communication projects independently.

Illustration BA

During this first-cycle study programme, students develop the visual-thinking skills necessary for independent work in all areas of public life, in which illustration is a means of communication or an important part of a visual communication unit.

In the first year, students acquire general knowledge that is later built on through several graded levels until the sixth semester. In the last semester, the students complete this programme by carrying out a demanding project demonstrating complex knowledge in the area of illustration, supported with a detailed analysis of the topic. The study programme encourages students to critically evaluate the results of the design work and puts them in touch, through different projects, with the working environment.

Illustration MA

Master's studies are based on independent work and on upgrading the acquired knowledge. Theoretical and practical analyses of the best international illustration form the basis for investigating students' creative potentials in the area of illustration.

As part of this study programme, students acquire the visual thinking skills required for independent work aiming at innovation, the effective realisation of the most demanding tasks and teamwork based on an interdisciplinary approach, cultivation of their own aesthetics and critical awareness of global issues. The students' projects are diverse, ranging from scientific illustration to illustration as narrative fiction or animation.

Doctor of Philosophy in Fine Art

The interdisciplinary doctoral programme in the humanities and social sciences is coordinated by the Faculty of Arts and the Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ljubljana. The doctoral programme leads to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Fine Arts.

Its aim is to educate highly qualified researchers, scholars and teaching staff, who are competent to carry out internationally comparable and interchangeable research into relevant theoretical and practical problems in the wide area of the fine arts (fine-arts theory, art theory, the history and theory of conservation and restoration, and the history and theory of design) and their conceptual, historiographical and heritological infrastructure.


The programme lasts 4 years (240 ECTS credits) and represents the third level of the Bologna cycle. The programme consists of organised classes (60 credits) and individual research work for the doctoral thesis (180 credits).

UL ALUO is actively involved in both the local context and the international space. This is reflected in the achievements of educators and our alumni, many of whom continue their studies at elite schools around the world and who gain excellent positions in influential companies (Google, IDEO, Helix Centre, the European Central Bank etc.), or establish their own start-ups. We carefully nurture and encourage international activity, as we are aware that openness to the international space is extremely important for the later careers of our students.

We participate in festivals, take home prizes in international competitions, and publish articles in renowned international journals. We often organise professional excursions (Basel, Graz, Munich, New York, Venice, Vienna, Warsaw, Zlin, etc.) and there is always an interesting exhibition or workshop with foreign partners to achieve a different perspective.

In addition to regular programmes (Erasmus+, CEEPUS), we have many other connections with international institutions.



International Summer Schools

are organised around diverse topics to explore and connect art, design and restoration, including curation and theory. We build thematic challenges based on close cooperation with the environment and interdisciplinary partners and with the involvement of internationally recognised mentors.




UL ALUO Collection

Since 1945, when the Slovenian Academy of Fine Arts was established and the ambition developed to build the first art collection, the Academy's collection has steadily grown through acquisitions and donations. In its nearly eighty-year history, the initial collection of 200 works by old masters was joined by 94 important artworks by Slovenian artists, painters and sculptors—mainly professors of the Academy of Fine Arts—as well as 200 paintings and sculptures and 82,430 prints by 3111 students of the Academy of Fine Arts. The collection of graphical works by the



students is particularly valuable since it shows the development of graphic art studies from the establishment of the Academy to the present day. The collection is envisaged to eventually include photography, graphic and industrial design.



UL ALUO Travels the World

Professors from the Academy are constantly studying, participating in projects and lecturing abroad. They have numerous exhibitions abroad, publish international articles, participate in conferences and are jury members of some of the most prominent professional competitions.

Contact with many global professional organisations, institutions and schools allows us to make much-needed comparisons in terms of levels of teaching, research and international projects. Direct insight into different pedagogical approaches and the diverse organisation of




study programmes gives us fresh ideas on how to improve our own home institution, in which we are embedded.
